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Annotation

Georgian, as a state language, dates back to the third century BC. The Georgian language has historically been a powerful lever of national consolidation. The language and the nation were inseparable from the very beginning. In general, in the early period, the Georgian language carried a common national mission. The Georgian language is a guarantee of the national unity. The Georgian literary language played a major role in the formation of a unified national and state worldview. The concept of "the Georgian language" includes both the Georgian language itself, as well as Megrelian-Chan and Svan, for which Georgian is the proto-language.
